FOOD AND WINE ACTIVITIES

OFFICIAL MEDIA RELEASE:

Sunday 15 November saw the dawn of At The Wharf – Wood, Wine and Song at Goolwa. This new event brought together Goolwa's traditional Smoke Off with some of the finest Langhorne Creek wineries, Fleurieu food producers and popular local band The Mactones laid down the beat for the day.

Wood Wine and Song, part of an ongoing series of events in the Goolwa Wharf precinct, was presented by the Cittaslow Goolwa Food and Wine Group in conjunction with the Langhorne Creek winemakers and was held in the Garden of Honour, Goolwa RSL. The event was generously supported by the Alexandrina Council, Kies Building Supplies, Shaw Family Vintners, Langhorne Creek Vintners and several Goolwa eateries.

Event representative Mr. Scott Woodsmith said "The Fleurieu has so much good food, wine and music it was only a matter of time before this was pulled together into one big community event."



The fun started at 11 am when Smoke Off teams lit their Webers and got to smoking their fare; from ham, various types of fish, chicken and lamb. This event catered to all tastes. The teams competed for prizes and trophies for the best smoked food, as judged by a panel consisting of local chefs Michael Duchow, Juliet Michell and Tony Love, national wine writer for the Advertiser and News Corp. As well, all team sites were eligible for the award for most creatively decorated site. The RSL team won the award for best ham, the Smoke Boat team was best in the Open Class and the Wentworth Parade Monopoly team won the best site award.

While the slow food of the Smoke Off was cooking away, spectators tried the wares of wineries like Bleasdale, Bremerton, Gipsie Jack, Shaw Family Vintners and many more. The new craft brewery Meechi Brewing Company was also represented. Food? Plenty from Cafelicious, Southy's Pizzas and more including the PipiCo bike from Bombora @ Goolwa Beach with their delicious Bbg Goolwa pipis.



The RSL bar was open and the Currency Creek CFS provided the everpopular sausage sizzle. To top it all off the traditional big Smoke Off raffle was drawn on the day.

From the start, people were strolling though Goolwa; from the Wharf Market to the Signal Point gallery and other art exhibitions to the Wood Wine and Song site, not forgetting the iconic Cockle Train. Mr

Woodsmith said "With people coming and going, there were often hundreds of people at any one time enjoying the festivities at Wood Wine and Song".

Proceeds from the day will be donated to the Goolwa CFS, the Currency Creek CFS as well as Cittaslow Goolwa to help ensure that this type of event continues to be presented.


The next auction is this Saturday 5 December and then on 9 January 2016.

BUSHFIRE SURVIVAL PLAN



Business operators and community members interested in local tourism had the opportunity to travel on board the lovely old paddlesteamer Oscar W a few weeks ago. Thank you to the volunteers who gave of their time for the special trip. The majority of those on board had never had a chance to experience life on the wood-fired steam-driven boat that chugged its way from the Goolwa wharf to the barrages, back under the Hindmarsh Island Bridge, along to near Laffins Point and back home again. All around us, the skies were black except for the stunning flashes of lightning that we could see in the northern skies. While parts of South Australia were lashed by storms, we were treated to perfectly calm conditions on the River Murray.
